Receiving Holy Communion

If you desire to receive Holy Communion on this occasion, and are baptized, and believe that Christ is truly present in the blessed Bread and Wine, as this Church teaches, we invite you to come forward and join us at the rail. If you have any questions about this, or any other teaching/practice of the Church, please feel free to consult the Priest.

You may receive Holy Communion in one of two ways. Either by first taking the host (bread) in your hand or on your tongue, and then drinking from the cup, or by intinction. If you choose to intinct please leave the host in your hand and the Server will take it and dip it in the cup, at which time they will place it on your tongue. If you wish to abstain from alcohol you may take Communion by only receiving the host and then returning to your seat, knowing that Christ is not divided and that those who receive him, receive all of him. Lastly if your children have not yet been prepared to receive their first Communion, or if you do not wish to commune, please cross your hands over your chest and a blessing will be given.
