If you choose to intinct please leave the host in your hand and the Server will take it and dip it in the cup, at which time they will place it on your tongue. If you wish to abstain from alcohol you may take Communion by only receiving the host and then returning to your seat, knowing that Christ is not divided and that those who receive him, receive all of him. Lastly if your children have not yet been prepared to receive their first Communion, or if you do not wish to commune, please cross your hands over your chest and a blessing will be given.
